We change destinies. We transform the system. Together, we bring children back home and give them the certainty that they will be #NeverAlone (#NiciodatăSingur).

Copil, Comunitate, Familie (Children, Communities, Families – CCF Moldova) is a non-governmental organisation dedicated to child protection, active in the Republic of Moldova since 2004. Since 2005, CCF Moldova has represented the UK-based foundation Hope and Homes for Children – a global expert in the reform of childcare systems.

For more than 21 years, we have been building solutions that help children grow up in safe and loving families, not in institutions.

We have contributed to the closure of 10 residential institutions and worked directly with **9 438 children and their families**. Where returning a child to their biological family was not possible, we developed alternative family-type services, so that every child has the chance to grow up in a family environment.

Behind these figures are changed lives, reunited families and children who have remained where they belong – at home.

CCF Moldova is a national expert and a partner of the state in upholding every child's right to family and education, actively contributing to the reform of the childcare system and to reaching the strategic goal of “zero children in residential institutions”. This role translates into concrete action: we train specialists, provide hands-on mentoring, develop services that can be scaled up nationally and contribute to shaping policies that place the child at the centre of every decision.

Why do we do this? Because a century of research has demonstrated that separating children from their families causes trauma and constitutes a form of abuse. Because we cannot be complicit in the serious violations and abuse committed by tearing children away from their family environment and placing them in a residential institution, we are committed to supporting the reform of the care system.

**Recognition for CCF Moldova
— Over the years, our efforts**

have been acknowledged both nationally and internationally:

In 2009, the United Nations Development Programme awarded CCF Moldova First Prize for “Initiatives in the field of human rights protection” for carrying out deinstitutionalisation projects and contributing to the implementation of the child protection reform.

In 2013, the ERSTE Foundation (Austria) awarded CCF Moldova the Prize for SOCIAL INNOVATION.

In 2015, UNICEF included the day-care service – the social nursery – in the UNICEF Compendium of positive practices for ensuring a family environment for children under the age of 3 in Eastern Europe and Central Asia.

In 2021, UN Moldova awarded the President of CCF Moldova, Liliana Rotaru, the Prize for outstanding achievements in the field of human rights at national level.

“We are already several months into 2026, yet this year, too, shows no strong signs of global peace, of unity in the face of hardship, or of inclusion for vulnerable groups. Looking back, we realise we have entered our seventh year of challenges.”

The biblical story of Joseph in Genesis reminds us that times of crisis are not accidental — they are part of a cycle that tests our ability to stand together. Between 2020 and 2026, we went through our own “seven years of hardship” — marked by the pandemic, insecurity and war. For many children and families, these crises meant loss, uncertainty and limited access to essential services, hitting hardest those who were already struggling. In such trying moments, the family remains the child’s first and most important line of support — the source of safety, stability and belonging. Supporting families, especially vulnerable ones, is not merely an act of solidarity; it is an essential investment in the resilience of children and of society as a whole.

In 2025, CCF Moldova continued to help families stay together or reunite, to support the authorities in developing services, to strengthen the capacities of the specialists working in the system, and to advocate, alongside its partners, for essential change in society. We kept learning from children and families how to support them better, with respect and dignity, recognising that the key to change lies in their hands. Our answer remains a collective one: solidarity, responsibility and mutual support. In hard times, what matters is not only resources, but also the way we choose to care for one another — so that no child is left behind.

Returning to the metaphor of the “seven lean years”, it is important to believe that they will be followed by “seven fruitful years”. Each of us has a part to play in this shared endeavour.”

Advocacy

Advocacy is an essential part of CCF Moldova’s work, through which field experience is turned into better public policies – evidence-based and geared towards the real needs of children and families.

In 2025, the organisation continued to play an active part in advancing the reform of the child protection system and in supporting the Republic of Moldova’s European path, in partnership with public authorities, international partners and civil society organisations.

CCF Moldova contributed to drafting and revising key strategic documents, such as Moldova’s Growth Plan Action Plan (2025–2027) and the Enlargement Report, taking an active part in consultations on social policy and highlighting the resources needed to carry the reforms forward. A constant emphasis was placed on promoting family-based care and

preventing institutionalisation, including through participation in high-level events and direct dialogue with European institutions and international partners. A new agreement was signed with the Ministry of Labour and Social Protection, strengthening priorities such as the development of professional foster care and the enforcement of the moratorium on placing young children in institutions. Internationally, CCF Moldova contributed to the processes of monitoring the implementation of children’s rights, providing analysis and recommendations and facilitating dialogue on matters such as the regulation of services and the financing of the reform.

Advocacy carried out in partnership amplifies impact and builds a common voice in the dialogue with decision-makers, helping to shape a child protection system that is more inclusive, family-oriented and aligned with European standards.

Reintegration into the family

Ensuring a stable family environment for every child remains our strategic priority. To this end, we work in partnership with public authorities, civil society organisations and donors to reduce reliance on residential institutions and to develop sustainable care alternatives.

Reintegration into the biological family is the first option. When that is not possible, we support integration into the extended family – grandparents or other relatives and people close to the child. For children who cannot return to their families, we develop and strengthen quality care alternatives, in particular professional foster care.

In 2025, we contributed to strengthening alternative family-type services. With the support of UNICEF Moldova and HHC UK, we trained 55 new professional foster care candidates, giving children the chance to grow up in a safe, caring and stable environment. A further 52 existing professional foster carers were supported throughout the year through the project “Stronger Services – Better Chances”, implemented in partnership with the Ministry of Labour and Social Protection of the Republic of Moldova, with the financial support of the United Kingdom.

Mia is HOME: the warmth of a home built together

In a village in Moldova, the story of Mia and her father shows that change becomes possible when people choose to get involved.

Mia was separated from her family and placed in a residential centre after her mother abandoned her, and her father, working abroad, could not return in time. Once back home, he decided to fight for his daughter and to give her a safe and stable home.

Mia's reintegration was made possible by a joint effort: support from the community, a contribution from the funds redirected through the 2% mechanism, and the involvement of

Vitalie Apostol, who ran 194 km and fundraised 41,100 lei for this case. With these resources, the house was brought up to a safe standard for raising a child: radiators were installed, essential works were carried out and adequate living conditions were secured.

Today, Mia is home. She attends kindergarten, while her father works and continues to build, step by step, the family's stability.

This case shows that when a parent's effort meets the solidarity of the community, a child can return to where they belong – to their family.

Preventing family separation

“For us it is an honour to represent CCF Moldova as Ambassadors. Throughout all these years we have trusted our partnership, because ahead of us lies a complicated yet beautiful mission — the wellbeing of children — and the organisation’s transparent actions are an incentive to get involved. With joint forces and the involvement of more people, we will see through the changes we have started for the wellbeing of children.”

Preventing the separation of children from their families is the organisation’s largest programme – through it, we manage to provide timely support to keep the children in the family environment, wherever the family is a resource and offers the best conditions for the child’s emotional, intellectual and physical development.

Early interventions, tailored to the needs of each family, can prevent situations that would otherwise lead to separation and long-term trauma. To this end, CCF Moldova, working with local authorities, identifies situations of risk early on and intervenes in line with the provisions of Law No. 140, to ensure the child’s protection and keep the child within the family.





In a modest house full of life, the fire burns quietly in the stove. The air carries the smell of warm food, and the parents are waiting for their children to come back from school and kindergarten. Today, calm and safety define the family of Vera and Dan. A year ago, however, things looked entirely different.

Vera and Dan are raising three children together: Daniela, aged 9, Ilie, aged 5, and Adam, aged 3. The family entered the CCF Moldova programme at a difficult moment, marked by serious health problems and financial instability. The father, Dan, has a disability that keeps him from working as much as he would like. Even so, he takes occasional work, as far as his health allows, and the family relies on the disability allowance and social assistance.

At the same time, one of the children has health issues requiring constant monitoring, treatment and rehabilitation

therapy. The cost of physiotherapy, non-reimbursed medicines and orthopaedic devices was a burden the family could hardly bear.

For a whole year, CCF Moldova stood by this family with a complex intervention: psychological, social and educational support. One of the children was enrolled in kindergarten, and the child with health problems received physiotherapy sessions, medical treatment and orthopaedic devices, all provided thanks to the support of our donors. The family also received regular donations of food, hygiene products and other necessities.

Through the “Rostul Postului” (The Meaning of Lent) campaign, the family received 100 chickens and feed for them, giving them not only a constant source of meat and eggs for the children, but also greater economic stability.

“Our children are so happy. Since we have had the hens, we always have meat and eggs, and for us it is an immense relief to know they are not short of food. They especially like the jarred meat,” the mother says.

Last year, CCF Moldova also contributed coal for heating the house over the winter.

In the meantime, the parents managed, from their own resources, to build a fence and a stove.

“We are calmer now. The children are well, and our life has settled into a normal rhythm,” says Dan.

Today, the family's situation is stable. The children go to school and kindergarten, and the parents look to the future with more confidence. This case shows that steady support, tailored to real needs, can change the course of a family's life and prevent children from being separated from their parents.

Experiences that last a lifetime

In 2025, 116 children from professional foster care services enjoyed days that meant more than fun – they were moments of discovery, friendship and confidence – all brought together by the social-emotional learning experiences.

Children from 8 districts of the country went to the theatre and the cinema, visited museums, the Zoo and a chocolate factory, and experienced the joy of a day at the ice rink. Every experience was built around their own wishes – because every child deserves to be heard and to live their childhood to the full.

Beyond the smiles, these activities meant greater confidence, stronger bonds between the children and memories that help them grow.

Education

In 2025, for CCF Moldova, inclusive education meant strengthening systemic interventions in schools and supporting professionals and families throughout the inclusion process, carried out through 3 major projects:

with the support of the Government of the United Kingdom, through the Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office.

In this way, the organisation contributed to the development of practical tools that have been validated, as well as to raising awareness and acceptance of diversity.

Key achievements include: carrying out the final research study with the participation of 572 parents and caregivers on attitudes towards the inclusion of children with special educational needs (SEN); the consultation, application and validation of the Psychosocial Assistance Programme for children and adolescents with SEN, and of the Practical Guide for supporting children with hearing disabilities

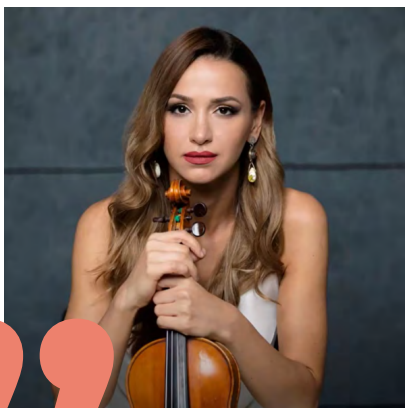


and autism spectrum disorders; the development of the Guide for creating sensory spaces “Exploring the Senses”; and the organisation of a conference that brought together 112 education professionals, decision-makers and development partners.

Activities were also organised to strengthen cooperation and develop professionals’ skills in inclusive education, supporting the creation of a cross-border network in the field of inclusive education.

These actions contributed to improving educational practice, strengthening teachers’ skills and creating school environments that are more inclusive and more responsive to the needs of every child.

Events and campaigns that bring us together for children

Sometimes, change begins with simple things: a running race, a birthday, a meal offered or a gesture made from the heart. Every act of involvement means more than a contribution: a calmer day for a parent, a new experience for a child, a family that manages to stay together.

Together, we build trust, stability and the chance of a childhood lived at home – and, for our country, systemic change.



Rostul Postului (The Meaning of Lent)

There are times of the year that invite quiet, reflection and closeness to what truly matters. Lent is one of them – a time when gestures take on deeper meaning, and caring for others becomes part of the way we choose to live.

For 9 years, the “Rostul Postului” (The Meaning of Lent) campaign has been bringing people together around meaningful deeds. More and more people choose to turn good intentions into action, contributing through the largest virtual restaurant – **www.rostulpostului.md**.

In 2025, 383 people chose to donate the cost of a meal, contributing 139,775 lei – money that helps us intervene where the needs are greatest.

From these gestures, simple and essential things come to life: households that grow, safer meals for children, and families that find the resources to move forward together.

Rostul Postului means more than a meal – it means choosing to invest in people, so they can build their own path. In this way, every contribution becomes part of a change that can be seen, felt and endures.

The 2% redirection

In 2025, 167 people chose to redirect 2% of their income tax to CCF Moldova, contributing 144,668 lei – the largest amount ever raised through this mechanism.

Through this option, anyone in formal employment can decide on the destination of a share of the tax they have already paid. Directed to CCF Moldova, these funds allow us to intervene with services tailored to each situation: material support; legal, psychological and social counselling; access to services; education; and solutions that give families long-term stability.

Every redirection serves the same goal: children growing up at home, in safety and with confidence in the future.

The Run for Children team

Elisa and her family in their new home

At only 6 years old, Elisa tells us about moments that marked her childhood far too early. She remembers how, on one cold night, her mother held her and her little brother Anton close to her chest as they sat in a railway station, with no roof over their heads. She also remembers the day when strangers came and took her away from her mother. For lack of alternative family-type services for very young children, Anton was placed in a residential centre, while Elisa was placed in a family-type form of protection. "I miss mummy," she would whisper every evening, hugging her loneliness. At every visit, tears flowed – hers and her mother's alike. For Elisa and her siblings, home meant the place where the family stays together. And that was their dream.

Thanks to the Run for Children campaign and the community's involvement, the little girl is with her mother again, and together with her siblings she is growing up in a home of their own – a place where the family has found peace and stability again. And their mother says, with emotion:

“*At last we have a home of our very own. Every day here brings us peace — a peace filled with their smiles.”*

Run for Children turned the runners' steps into a safe roof and a new beginning for this family.

Viviana's story — a voice gaining courage

She needed speech therapy sessions and medicines whose cost was not reimbursed, yet her family could not afford these expenses. Both parents have a disability status, and the father works in construction to cover the family's daily needs.

Thanks to the "Donate your birthday" campaign, Viviana received the support she needed: treatment and speech therapy. Today she is making visible progress – she is beginning to pronounce words more easily, to communicate and to gain confidence in herself.

For Viviana, every day is now a step forward – and for us, proof that solidarity can offer not only support, but also a voice to every child.

Pușculița cu Povești (The Piggy Bank of Stories)

Over the winter holidays, CCF Moldova and Fundația Felicia organised the fifth edition of the “Pușculița cu Povești” (The Piggy Bank of Stories) campaign – an initiative dedicated to children and families in difficulty.

With the community’s support, we raised **92 460 lei** – an amount that was turned into safety, support and hope for those who need it most. The campaign was carried out together with Ilinca Avram and our partners Victoriabank and PORT MALL, bringing together people who chose to

stand close to other people. At the end of the campaign, **Fundația Felicia** matched the amount raised, doubling the impact of every donation and helping to extend the support offered to vulnerable families.

Every contribution meant care, responsibility and confidence that good done together reaches where it matters most. “Pușculița cu Povești” showed us, once again, that solidarity can bring light and hope into children’s lives.



Give Warmth

Through the “Give the Gift of Warmth” (Dăruiește căldură) campaign, run together with the European Business Association Moldova, we raised **67 000 lei** – resources that provided direct support to 38 children in difficult situations.

For families of limited means, winter is not just a season – it is a daily struggle, in which hardship can put the unity of the family at risk. Every contribution made through this campaign meant more than material support: it brought safety, stability and hope.

The stage welcomed acclaimed artists such as Tania Turtureanu and Cristian Spătaru, as well as the talented children of the Weekend Academy, offering the audience memorable artistic moments.

The charity auction, led by auctioneer Vlad Babenco, raised 57,100 euros, surpassing the record of the previous edition. Among the most valuable lots were the painting "Wind of Change", created by Sergiu Țopa and signed by the members of the band Scorpions, and a shirt signed by Nadia Comăneci, each auctioned for 10,000 euros. The funds raised will finance the development of the first community home in Chișinău for young people with severe disabilities, who at the age of 18 risk being placed in a nursing home.

The works were distributed in hundreds of copies, and the funds raised – 88,941 lei – went directly towards supporting children and families in difficulty.

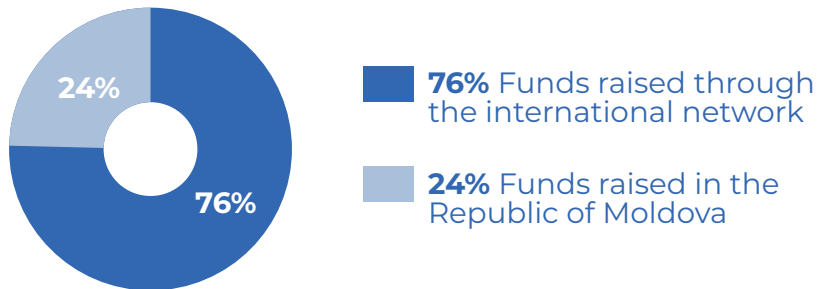
